#### From the Pastor's Pen

I am writing this just a few days before the election and thinking (a) we will all be glad when the campaigns are finished, and (b) how fortunate we are to live in a vigorous democracy. I hope you voted.

This time of year calendars fill up quickly. Thanksgiving is at hand and Advent and Christmas will soon follow. The church is once again planning on hosting a Thanksgiving Dinner. I am glad. I have good memories of the fellowship and food we enjoyed last year as we celebrated Thanksgiving at the church. I encourage you to put it on your calendar if you are in town.

The Sunday School team is preparing for a Christmas play which will be all or part of our worship service on December 19<sup>th</sup>. We will have rehearsal the Sunday and Wednesday before and good lessons planned for November and December. Thanks to all the teachers, parents, children and youth.

Our newly forming friendship with Rev. Ron and Rev. Danelle McKinney and the students at the Native American Education and Cultural Center is a cause for celebration and thanksgiving. I don't know what the future holds but our time together in October and November has been rich and joy filled.

Dustin Bartlett has taken a leadership role in reaching out to the Gay Straight Alliance on the SDSU campus. And, he is providing leadership for our membership survey and stewardship program.

Dustin and Rev. Carl Kline have been working with others in the community to facilitate a Muslim-Christian conversation. Going through my library at home I came across Edward W. Said's book, *Covering Islam: How the Media and the Experts Determine How We See the Rest of the World* (Vintage Press). Said says, "My contention is that most of this [media coverage of Islam] is unacceptable generalization of the most irresponsible sort... and could never be used for any other religious, cultural, or demographic group on earth." I am glad for the Brookings conversations.

After the church council voted to affirm our relationship with the BackPack Project, the management team submitted a grant to the Larson Foundation requesting funding for part-time staff positions. The Foundation responded by awarding BBP a grant of \$50,000. What an outstanding vote of confidence. We are indeed thankful to the Larson Foundation for this generous support, and to the individuals who submitted the grant and have been providing key leadership to BBP, and to BUCC council and community.

And I still haven't mentioned the Wednesday night fellowship, the Final Friday, Sunday Bible study, the music group, and the list is growing.

As you can see, there is a lot to celebrate and a lot for which we can and do give thanks. Looking to the future, I have shared with the council my hopes that as we prepare for 2011 we will begin to focus on three broad areas of our common life so that we can continue these and other important ministries. The three areas are: membership, mission, and money. How do we who are members and friends of BUCC feel about our church? What areas of mission and ministry are important to us? And how will support these ministries financially? I hope that we can use our annual meeting in January to share our hopes and dreams for the future of this wonderful church.

# NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURAL CENTER


